DEVELOPMENT INCENTIVES – NEW & UPDATED

The BUILD Bassano – Residential Vacant Land Development Incentive Policy was amended.

No public petitions were received regarding the termed development incentive policy to sell vacant residential land under fair market value. After much deliberation, council amended this policy to exclude mobile home developments from the incentive. All other sections of the policy remain unchanged.

BUILD Bassano – COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT INCENTIVE

The incentive is aimed at **new** commercial and industrial developments and is intended to:

1. To stimulate commercial development in Bassano.
2. To support business expansion that leads to job growth in Bassano.
3. To create stability within the local economy and business community.
4. To support local businesses.
5. To encourage investments that will grow Bassano.

This is a termed development incentive. The total valuation of the incentive is \$150,000 in overall municipal tax credits. The term began on June 12, 2023, and runs until December 31, 2025, or until that total valuation of the municipal tax credits has been allocated, whichever comes first.

1. A municipal tax credit is applied to the Commercial Development (at occupancy) based on an improved property assessment. The property assessment is determined by the Town’s assessor. Property assessment is not fair market value.
2. To be eligible for the municipal tax credit, the property’s assessment must reach a minimum of 250,000 for a Commercial Development (land and improvements) as shown below. This is for **new** builds only.

Property Assessment	Tax Credit Applied
250,000 to 350,000	\$10,000
351,000 to 550,000	\$20,000
551,000 to 750,000	\$25,000

Any commercial development that exceeds an assessed value of 750,000 shall be looked at independent of this incentive by the Town.

The development incentive does not apply to any approved developments, or previously started projects (e.g. South Country Co-op or 1002 – 2nd Avenue).

WATER CONSERVATION

The Eastern Irrigation District (EID) reported a significant drop in river levels, six to eight weeks earlier than normal this year due to low snowpack and early snowmelt in the region. With drought like conditions, the EID has asked that communities take measures to reduce water usage to support conservation efforts as we all rely on the same water source.

Town council supports the request from the EID and will lead by example. While we appreciate lush green grass, it is time to appreciate a more natural brown landscape. The town will reduce the watering of public lands by 1/3 in addition to assessing where we can limit water draw for public works operations.

18 SUPERB WAYS TO SAVE WATER IN YOUR HOME

In the United States, 400 billion gallons of water are used per day

- 1 Monitor your monthly water bill
- 2 Regularly check hoses and faucets for leaks
- 3 Learn how to check water meter for water leaks
- 4 Insulate hot water pipes
- 5 Take 5-minute showers instead of a full bath
- 6 Install water-saving showerheads
- 7 Do not leave running water while brushing your teeth or shaving
- 8 Convert to dual-flush toilet
- 9 Do not flush trash or cigarette butts in the toilet
- 10 Turn off the faucet when lathering hands
- 11 Use a pan of water when cleaning vegetables instead of running water
- 12 Run the dishwasher only when it is full
- 13 Soak pots and pans in water. Don't let water run while scraping them clean.
- 14 Use clothes washer only on full loads
- 15 Use eco setting when using the washing machine
- 16 Use buckets instead of hose for cleaning floors, windows, and cars
- 17 Install greywater collection tank (water collected can be used in gardening and toilet)
- 18 Water the garden early in the morning & late in the evening (less evaporation)



The **Bassano Fire Department** is acutely **aware of the hot and dry conditions** expected this summer and wish to remind all residents to be fire smart.

- ✓ If you are having a backyard fire in an approved pit, ensure the area around the fire pit has been watered. Always keep the fire arresstor (screen) on top of the fire pit. Keep your fires small to help limit sparks. **ALWAYS put your fire out**, stir the ash, water, and stir again. Do not leave fires unattended. Keep a fire extinguisher nearby.
- ✓ Do not toss your cigarettes. Ensure they are fully put out before disposal.
- ✓ If you are outside recreating, do not park a hot vehicle in tall grass. The heat from the exhaust can start a fire.

OUR REMINDERS

Do not park **unhooked** trailers on public roadways.



Do not block intersections or restrict corner visibility with vehicles and trailers.

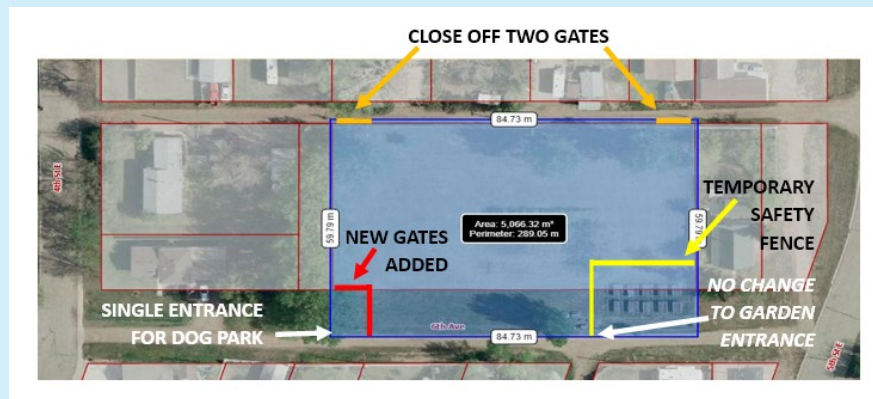

The Bassano Off-leash Dog Park Advances...

Community driven initiatives are a great thing. A group of volunteers and dog owners approached the town in late 2022 to discuss the potential of an off-leash dog park. They were directed to prepare a business plan. Having completed a business plan, a PILOT PROJECT will be considered within the underutilized greenspace at the Kinette Park (514 – 6th Avenue).

To begin, volunteers, led by Grant McCargar will engage with residents that live adjacent to the park and provide them with a letter explaining the project. With 70% acceptance, the pilot project will proceed at this location.



This is a low-cost pilot project, that can be built by volunteers. It is expected that this park will be operated through an Ambassador Program. Off-leash areas allow owners to exercise their dogs, and they create a place for socialization and wellbeing. Stay tuned for more information.
