SUPPORTS

Seniors Benefits

Throughout May we provided service to 5 individuals in submitting Seniors Benefits.

Referrals/ Supports

As part of our services FCSS provides support to individuals in aiding access to various supports such as government programs, housing assistance and food bank access. During May we provided 3 clients with referrals to various supports and aided through the application process.

PROGRAMS

Rural Pop Up

The next upcoming session is to be held on July 16 at the Community Hall from 10-11:30, with the addition of the Car Seat Clinic.

Community Garden

Members of the Off-Leash Dog Park pilot project consulted with FCSS on April 30 to discuss fencing around the Community Garden area. Both parties agreed it is beneficial to fasten a temporary fence until their pilot has been completed, and once successful move to a permanent fence. The entrance to the garden has been moved to the Southeast corner, and water accessibility has been maintained with hoses that can pass through the fencing, however concerns have been raised surrounding accessibility to the garden for those with mobility issues and the need to bring supplies into the space. We will continue to work with the Dog Park Committee to reach a mutually beneficial resolution allowing Garden patrons ease of access.

Canadian Volunteer Income Tax Program

The April 30 deadline by the Canadian Revenue Agency for penalty free tax filing has passed. Tax preparations have slowed, however FCSS will maintain this service for the remainder of 2024 to allow community members to file as needed. To date 43 preparations have been completed in the office.

Beginners Yoga

Our first yoga session took place on May 5th at the Bassano Community Hall. We have 17 individuals registered and participate weekly. Program surveys will be distributed at the last session to help us determine interest for additional sessions possibly this upcoming fall.

Bike Safety Rodeo

In collaboration with Brooks Safe Communities, Bassano RCMP, and Bylaw Enforcement we successfully delivered the Bike Safety Rodeo to the Grades 1-4 students at Bassano School. They

learned about the purpose of helmets, roadway safety skills and practices then put this knowledge to practice in navigating their way through the bike course designed to reinforce those practices in safety.

Earth Day Craft Kits

We prepared 25 Earth Day Craft kits containing Seed Bombs, Bird Feeders, Recycling awareness and Nature Journaling for distribution locally. All of our kits went out to local children between the ages of 4 – 12 and were designed to promote actions that protect and preserve our planet.

Gratitude Journals

The last of our Gratitude Journals have been distributed, in total we prepared 70 journals. These were free for pick up at local businesses, and the second journal in our journey toward creating whole-body wellness within the community. The third installment of journals will go out this fall with our "Manifestation Journal".

Babysitters and Home Alone Courses

Many parents with school aged children are facing the end of the school year, this can be a stressful time as they face challenges in acquiring adequate care for children. To help prepare children for the possibility of being home alone and or to become a caregiver to a younger child or sibling we offered Red Cross Home Alone and Babysitters Courses designed to provide foundational skills and knowledge to build confidence for both children and parents. We had 6 students attend the Babysitters Course and 12 attend the Home Alone program from Bassano and the County of Newell.

Small Town Smoke Down - FCSS Kids Q - June 8

We have begun accepting registrations for our FCSS sponsored Kids Q occurring on June 8, 2024 at the 3rd annual Small Town Smoke Down. This is the first year FCSS will be sponsoring the event. As part of the program participants receive a Kids Q apron, swag bag and free entry with meat provision. The program offers an excellent opportunity to teach safe food handling, hand washing and personal safety while preparing food.

In keeping with previous programming, the age range was kept consistent with the original ages of 6-14 and we opted to prepare boneless pork loin for two reasons a) Hamburgers are quite messy and b) judging process does not allow for the use of buns/condiments.

In learning from errors program details will be fully disclosed to Advisory Board members before program advertising goes to the public to ensure all parties are sharing accurate information.

P-FCSS014 FCSS Program Subsidy Policy

BACKGROUND

At the April 8, 2024 FCSS Advisory Board meeting members expressed an interest in providing program subsidy on a program to program basis to help create equitable access to FCSS preventative education and programs for community members. This prompted the development of a policy that lays out the guidelines for access to program fee subsidy.

POLICY OVERVIEW

Bassano FCSS will reserve \$500.00 annually commencing January 1, 2025 to be allocated to program fee subsidy based upon the current Low Income Cut Off or Alberta Seniors Benefits eligibility income threshold. Individuals may apply for the subsidy on a program-to-program basis, the Director will ensure those meeting the criteria will receive 50% program subsidy until allocated funds have been dispersed.

Policy Statement

The FCSS Advisory Board is responsible to develop, maintain, and provide preventative based social programs and support services in Bassano pursuant to the Family and Community Support Services Act, the Family and Community Support Services Regulation, and the Town's strategic plan.

Purpose Statement

To provide low-income individuals/families with the opportunity to receive a full program subsidization to increase accessibility to FCSS facilitated social and educational programs.

Definitions

Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) – means the administrative head of the municipality.

Council – means the elected body of the Town.

Director – means the FCSS Director, an employee of the Town, that is dedicated to the FCSS Advisory Board managing social programs and services.

Bassano FCSS – means Family and Community Support Services.

FCSS Advisory Board – a volunteer advisory board of directors appointed by council with the responsibility of leading and managing social programming in the Town.

Town – means the incorporated municipally of Bassano.

Participant – means the person registering for a program.

Subsidy – money given as part of the cost of something.

Low Income Cut Off (LICO) – represents the poverty line as set by Statistics Canada, updated yearly based on the inflation rate.



It is the responsibility of the Director to ensure this policy is implemented.

Guidelines

 These guidelines set out the minimum requirements for a resident to be accepted into the Fee Assistance Program. To be eligible for fee assistance, applicant's income must fall below the Government of Canada's Low Income Cut-Off or Alberta Seniors Benefits eligibility income threshold.

- 2. Applicants must provide the following information:
 - a. Address proving, that they are a resident of the Town or Division 6 of the County of Newell.
 - b. Current proof of their Canada Revenue Agency Notice of Assessment or Reassessment for each household member over the age of 18 – Total income is shown on line 150.
- 3. If accepted into the program applicants will receive a non-cash subsidy applied to 100% of the registration fee.
- 4. Access to the Program is non-transferable and does not carry forward year-overyear.

5. Failure to attend the subsidized program will result in forfeiture of opportunity to apply for future programming subsidy for a term of one year.

Process

The FCSS Advisory Board shall allocate \$500.00 per annum to the Program Subsidy, access the Program Subsidy is based on a first come first served basis.

- 1. If residents wish to participate in the program, they must submit an application (Schedule A) to the Town.
- 2. The form will be reviewed by the FCSS Director.
- 3. Once approved, applicants will be required to pay the remainder of the 50% registration fee.

SUMMER 2024 PROGRAMMING

BACKGROUND

Bassano FCSS has created a focus on whole body wellness since 2023 by providing programming options that help promote physical, emotional, and spiritual wellbeing through capacity building, awareness, and inclusive accessible programs. Understanding that each of these elements of wellbeing are interconnected. The programs FCSS offers are designed to engage a wide variety of demographics enhancing the wellbeing of our community members and the County of Newell.

This year Bassano will also be co-hosting the bi-annual Bassano Damfest and Culture Days event organized by Bassano Arts Council. This event celebrates a wide variety of arts and culture locally, live music, art displays, culinary classes and Indigenous culture celebration are among programming.

Last summer our programs focused on active living across the age span, Social Skill development, and Aquatic Safety. We also created Craft and Activity packages that engaged children in artistic and physical wellness.

Programs we offered in Summer of 2023 that we could offer again include:

RETURN PROGRAM OPTIONS

Drowning Prevention Week

Summer sunshine and warmer climates encourage many Albertans to enjoy aquatic pursuits. Alberta has an impressive number of unmonitored bodies of water creating a need for water safety education. Drowning Prevention Week which occurs July 21-27 provides an opportunity to provide preventative education to all demographics. We collaborated with Bassano Outdoor Pool to provide drowning prevention education and lifesaving skill games in the pool. Knox Presbyterian Church supplied the Outdoor Pool rental for this event in 2023, with open swim from 1-3. FCSS supplied educational materials and a free sundae to all in attendance. From this baseline FCSS could facilitate collaborations to run a drowning prevention event this summer at the Bassano Outdoor Pool. Knox Presbyterian Church has asked FCSS to partner with them for an open swim day at the Bassano Outdoor Pool on July 7th tentatively. This is an opportunity to also partner with Newell County Fire Services to facilitate a boat safety presentation.

This year we received the grant from the Community Foundation of Southeastern Alberta to provide free swimming lessons to the students at Bassano School, Lifesaver Sundae provides supplemental information the ties closely to our commitment in providing aquatic prevention barrier free to our subscribers.

Bassano FCSS would allocate \$300 to facilitation.

Summer Social

The Summer Social was a program created last year to engage elementary school aged children in expanding their understanding of their thoughts, feelings, and emotions, allowing growth in social understanding and emotional intelligence. In 2023 we ran 2 one-week sessions consisting of an hour each. Through the stories by Jory John students can enter the shoes of the characters, gaining insight and perspective aiding in social development. This program was paired with Emotional Regulation Yoga adding the physical wellness element and could possibly be expanded upon to include healthy eating, vision boards and artistic self-expression.

Bassano FCSS would allocate \$150 to facilitation.

Open Sport Days

Bassano FCSS hosted open sporting days last spring and summer to engage the community in outdoor leisure activities and provide the ability for individuals to access partnered sports aiding in the reduction of social isolation. Some of the sports offered included Tennis, Disc Golf, and Bowling. With the Communities Choosewell Grant receipt of \$5,000 we have an opportunity to begin expanding and improving upon Open Sports and allowing continuation through winter months as well. FCSS would provide 2 opportunities weekly to engage participants in opportunities that require another person to play.

There would be no additional budget allocation to facilitate.

Summer Craft Kits

Bassano FCSS created 60 craft kits last summer that were distributed to Bassano and County of Newell residents. Each kit contained serval hours of enjoyment for children 4-12 years of age. These kits included games, crafts and activities that promoted social, emotional and physical wellness. They also promoted the development of gross and fine motor skills, lessening the chance of summer regression in skills.

Summer kits were extremely popular last year, we received feedback from locals stating that they had utilized the contents multiple times and that the recipients enjoyed the crafts and activities within.

If choosing to prepare kits in 2024 a program budget of \$300 would be allocated to development.

Parade of Garage Sales

Each year Bassano FCSS provides administrative support to the development of our local Parade of Garage Sales. Each year we have seen an increase of advertised sales and the volume of shoppers that are coming from the county to partake in these sales. We have also noted that some local

groups/organizations have also begun programming for this event. This is a cost-free program requiring administrative time.

NEW PROGRAM OPTIONS

Strollin with Seniors

This program would be a weekly collaboration with Bassano Playfair Lodge. Bassano FCSS and other local volunteers could provide outdoor walking to seniors at our local lodge on a once weekly basis. This will provide a break from social isolation and allow much needed outdoor time for seniors faced with mobility issues. These outings could include the occasional ice cream stop or snack in the park providing additional social interactions. Bassano FCSS will provide volunteer recruitment for this program.

This is a cost-free program requiring only the procurement of volunteers, if incorporating stops budgetary allowance of \$100 would be provided.



Classroom Kits for Kids

Every September the kids say goodbye to summer holidays and make preparations to head back to school. For some families this can be a stressful and financially taxing time of year. Many local families are struggling to afford not only the fees to attend school but also the additional costs of purchasing supplies. Bassano FCSS has an opportunity to engage the community in aiding these families by doing a school supply drive. Locals could donate any unopened school supplies they no longer need or make a financial contribution. FCSS would then create backpacks for children and donate them to Bassano School to distribute to students in need. If choosing to proceed with this program, FCSS would research grant funding availability to help offset costs.

A budget allocation of \$250.00 would be allocated to this program.

Pool Pop Up Art Shop

Let's bring a fun aquatic based activity to the kids!

Each year the Bassano Pool draws in a big crowd from all over the County. Families take in the day relaxing, enjoying the water and getting a kiss from the sun. To engage the community and provide a mini break to swimmers Bassano FCSS could provide a free crafternoon at the pool for children.

This program would allow children to create their own Ocean in a Jar or an Ocean Floor Diorama. FCSS could set up supplies in the joint use area so as to not interrupt within the pool area.

Bassano Damfest and Culture Days - Children's Watercolor Painting

BACKGROUND

Bassano Damfest and Culture days is slated to occur on September 13-14, 2024 thanks to the hard work of the Bassano Arts Council and community partners. For this year's programming Bassano FCSS has partnered with Bassano Arts Council to help prepare programming that aligns with National Day of Truth and Reconciliation to provide a variety of Indigenous based activities including a Kiros Blanket Exercise, Dancing, Drumming and a Bannock Taco Lunch. Bassano FCSS has also provided administrative support in the procurement of grant funding that allows for free programming throughout the event.

To further support the events at Bassano Damfest and Culture Days Bassano FCSS could provide a children's art-based activity, consisting of watercolor painting on a predesigned canvas, to help encourage youth to develop artistic skills. The program would be one hour long, hosted in the Community Hall or greenspace. Bassano FCSS at present has these supplies to accommodate 40 participants. No additional budget allocation would be required for delivery. FCSS volunteers (2) would be needed for approximately 1 hr for program support.
