## Municipal Logo Modernization Project

For the past few years, council expressed an interest to modernize the Town's logo. Until recently, there were various renderings of a municipal logo being used. And while the original municipal logos served a purpose, they needed to be freshened up. Keeping true to our roots, the new logo is again centered around the Bassano Dam. Council approved the final design at their December 12, 2022 meeting.

Administration has been directed to develop a policy for council's review to retire the use of the former logos. Any existing stationary and swag will be used. The cost to design the logo was \$650. As new assets are ordered (such as the new street marking signs), logos will be updated. Much of the work to complete the project will be done by administration.

## Dog Control Bylaw 928/22 – Approved



The community was invited to participate in a review/modernization of a local dog control bylaw. Bylaw 928/22 was introduced in September 2022. Council asked for feedback by December 1. One formal response was received from a community member, thanking the council for relaxing restrictions on various dog breeds. There were online and in-person discussions at the Town Office. Overall, the proposed changes within the modernized bylaw addressed a number of concerns that the Town had received over the past few years. With the support of those that chose to participate in this project, council passed Dog Control Bylaw 928/22 at their December 12, 2022 meeting as presented in the November 2022 newsletter. ## Off-leash Dog Park – One Thing Leads to Another

The introduction of a modernized dog control bylaw sparked the renewal of an off-leash dog park in Bassano. In 2021, the idea was proposed to the public as an opportunity for a community driven project. A group of interested volunteers have stepped up. Led by Grant McGarger, the group presented to council at the December 12, 2022 meeting with four specific requests, 1) that council recognize the volunteer working group; 2) that council agrees to establish an off-leash dog park; 3) that the town sets parameters for the volunteer working group; and 4) that the town assigns a liaison to the volunteer working group.

Having heard the delegation, council agreed to reconvene discussions and consider the request at their meetings in early 2023. We would like to hear from you. What are your views on an off-leash dog park? Is this an asset that would improve the quality of life for pet owners in Bassano?

The generalized feedback will be compiled and shared with council. If council chooses to support the idea of an off-leash dog park further direction will be given to administration and the working group regarding public engagement.

## Various Council Updates

Nick Baer was appointed as a volunteer member of the Bassano Fire Department.

Kevin Jones was appointed as a volunteer on the FCSS Advisory Board.

The 2023 Bassano Memorial Library budget was approved with an allocation of \$15,660 (no change from 2022).

The public lands watering policy was updated for 2023 to include increased watering at the Town Office, the Community Hall, and the Cenotaph grounds. In addition, the hours for watering at the community gardens was changed be more inclusive for early morning waters/workers. Watering will be available Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 6:00 a.m. – 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m.

The Town and the County approved an 8% increase to the Recreation Funding Committee grant. \$54,000 is available to user groups in 2023. Applications are available on the Town's website [bassano.ca/recreation-funding-grant/](http://bassano.ca/recreation-funding-grant/)

Dale Luchuck was appointed as the volunteer member at large for the Municipal Planning Commission for a one-year term.

Council approved a Disc Golf Maintenance Policy. The course will be maintained by the public works department and the library will be responsible for all capital costs. To promote this new asset, the Town will contribute up to \$2,000 for the installation of a main sign for the disc golf course.

The outdoor pool liner must be replaced in 2023. The Town will work in partnership with the Bassano Enhancement Society to complete this project. A CFEP grant application is being submitted to the province. The estimated project cost is \$300,000 and will be planned for the fall.

An upgrade to the bulk water loading station at the water treatment plant was approved to increase pump capacity from 1m<sup>3</sup>/minute to 2m<sup>3</sup>/minute. This upgrade supports business and industry users. The estimated project cost is \$35,000 and will be funded by bulk water revenue. Bulk water is pulled from the main distribution line and does not change waterflow or pressure within the Town.

Council agreed to take ownership of unsold properties following the tax auction. Once title transfers are complete the properties will be listed for sale. 701 – 2 Avenue; 242 – 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue; and 415 – 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue.

## Generosity Never Goes Unnoticed – Thank you!

Over the past few months, there has been an outpouring of generosity. The Arena Management Board (AMB) hosted a community fundraiser in November to generate funds for plant upgrades. Over \$140,000 was generated through this event. The AMB plans to upgrade condenser in 2023/24 and the chiller is slated for replacement in 2027.

White Fox Group Ltd. donated \$5,000 towards energy efficiency lighting upgrades at the Community Hall to include stage lighting and a sound system.

\$8,500 in sponsorships and donations were received to support the Christmas Hamper program delivered by the FCSS Department in December.
